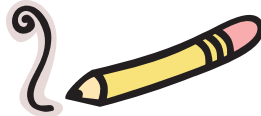

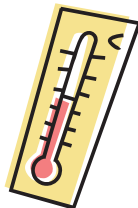

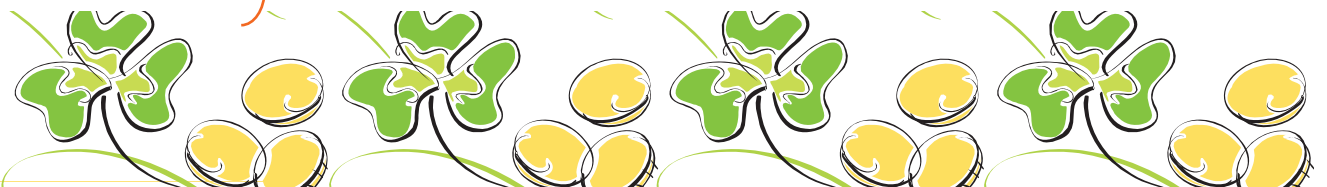
I look forward to seeing everyone on March 1st at the Carnival and Silent Auction!

Some students have picked

up on the fact that the toys and centers do not always stay the same... Mrs. Bartlett and Mrs. Wheeler wisely change things up when they are not expecting it.

For the Busy Bees, life is pretty good. They are learning a lot without even realizing it. When I had the privilege of having a special snack with the class before Christmas, they used their *addresses* as a way to take turns going to the snack table. The class is learning to be more independent in preparation for Kindergarten next year. So far, "Mr. H" has been a hit, as the students drew his "Horrible Hair." Although, "Mr. F" was very *funny*, inspiring lots of silly show and tell items on Friday. When I asked them what they thought about Kindergarten next year, they said, "It will be fun... but I don't know how it will be different."

During circle time, the students have been keeping a countdown until spring- 36 days left on the day I visited. They have also been keeping weather logs, and "Cloudy" has definitely been winning so far, though I think "Snowy" may soon be a competitor! Rain or shine, these kids are making the most of their time, and whether they know it or not, they will be very ready for whatever comes next!
