ways to give...

- 1. Choose tags from the Weekday School giving tree.
- 2. Use our Target gift registry (online and in-stores).
 - a. Visit https://www.target.com/gift-registry
 - b. Click "search for an organization"
 - c. Type in "Duke Memorial United Methodist Church"

general guidelines...

- Items should be left by DMWS's giving tree.
- Online orders may be shipped directly to the church, but must be received by Nov. 9th.
- Tree tags list broad categories so that your children have the experience of selecting a gift that will be kid approved.
- The goal of the market is to have the bulk of gifts priced at \$1-\$3 (75% off retail price). We would rather have more lower priced than big ticket items. (ie. \$15-\$20 lego set vs. \$40).

guidelines for new items...

- Gifts should be unwrapped.
- DO NOT remove price tags.
- If you get an item requiring batteries, consider attaching batteries to the package.

 We DO NOT accept weapons (including Nerf).

Giving Tree 2018

With just a little over seven weeks until Christmas, it's already time to start thinking about our annual Giving Tree! The Giving Tree is our way of giving back to the community and fostering the sharing and caring spirit with our children.

We are excited to be partnering with our very own Duke Memorial United Methodist Church and their Christmas Market again this year. The Duke Memorial Christmas Market is a one-day, low-cost holiday shopping event for Durham families with limited financial means. It gives parents an opportunity to give Christmas gifts to their children and honors their dignity by letting them to do the shopping themselves. It gives donors a chance to share God's love and experience the true meaning of Christmas.

Families who receive services from our partner agencies are invited to shop at the Christmas Market. Agencies (Urban Ministries, Habitat for Humanity, IHN, etc.) distribute Shopper's Passes to families (1 pass per child) based on need and circumstance. New and gently used items are accepted and sold at 75% off retail. Proceeds from the market go back the partner agencies.

This year's Christmas Market will be held on Saturday, December 8th, so we will be collecting gifts during the first few weeks of November. The Giving Tree will be set up in the hallway of the Weekday School, so please plan to stop by the "tree" with your child(ren) to select an ornament (or two) to donate to the Market. Once purchased, please bring the unwrapped items back to the school or church office (there will be a collection bin located outside of the church office). Please do not remove price tags.

The organizers of the Market have also set up Target Wish List for hot ticket items. You may shop in stores or online using the gift registry. To shop online, go to: text-up-start-10 The registry is an excellent resource since it is customized to include items we have learned are most desirable and to exclude items we don't allow or already have plenty of.

DMWS Inclement Weather Policy

When the **Durham Public Schools are closed due to inclement weather, Duke Memorial Weekday School will be closed.** If Durham Public Schools are delayed, the Director will determine if Duke Memorial Weekday School should be open, closed, or operate on a delay.

Factors considered when assessing whether to close, open on time or on a delay include, but are not limited to: teacher availability to fulfill Safe Sanctuaries requirements, the condition of Memorial Drive/sidewalks along Memorial Drive, and timing of the inclement weather event. Parents should check for cancellation/delay information on WTVD and WRAL. Attempts will be made to notify all families by email and by using the REMIND texting service. The decision as to whether or not Duke Memorial Weekday School opens on a delay will be made with the utmost consideration of safety for all of our families and staff members. Use of these makeup days is at the discretion of the Director.

Safety and Security at DMWS

DMWS has many policies and procedures in place to ensure the safety of staff and students. Our staff undergoes CPR/First Aid/AED training every other year. You may have heard your children talk about having fire drills. Our fire extinguishers are inspected yearly and we also have periodic facility fire safety checks. Every spring we conduct a tornado drill so the teachers and children can practice their "turtle positions".

Our staff has a lock-down drill yearly on a teacher workday. Emergency information is displayed prominently in each classroom. We also have exterior and interior security cameras that are monitored by the church office. Carpool line allows us to safely and quickly welcome and dismiss students each day by minimizing walking across Memorial Drive. Requiring the use of assigned carpool numbers allows us to be sure children leave with approved individuals.

Duke Memorial United Methodist Church helps us maintain a secure environment. Admittance to the facility is controlled in several ways. Our playground is locked during non-school hours. All exterior doors remain locked during the week. Some doors have keypads for entry. The parent code provided for you works during school hours in case you need to enter the building. Codes are to be changed on a yearly basis. Visitors to DMWS who do not have a code must be on a list in the church office for admittance on a particular day. Those individuals are buzzed in through the awning doorway. If a parent forgets the code, church office staff will ask for the child's name and name of the teacher in order to be admitted. Persons who do not have the code or are not on the visitor list for that day must walk around to the front of the facility and be admitted through the Welcome Center. Once there, the appropriate person must come to the Welcome Center to escort their visitor to the proper area.

Please help us keep the building safe by not holding the door for others to enter the building. Also help us by checking in at the preschool office if you are picking up a child early or arriving late for school.
