Welcome to a new school year! The staff at DMWS is excited to partner with your family during your child's preschool experience. Safety of the children and staff is very important to us. Please remember our carpool line is a CELL FREE ZONE. This includes all parking lots. If you are walking in or out of our facility with your child, please hold hands at all times and cross Memorial Drive at the crosswalk. If you enter the building after carpool line has ended, please come by the office to sign in. We encourage parents to come to observe their child at any time, but we do ask that you sign in through the office so we are aware of who is in the school at all times. Your child's teacher will share the new door code that allows you to access the building during school hours. All persons who need access to the building have a code so please do not hold the door open to allow others entry. If you forget the code and need to buzz in, you must provide both your child's name and the teacher's name. If you cannot provide that information, you will be asked to walk to the church Welcome Center entrance for admittance.

Be sure to check our website www.dmws.org to keep undated on important information and access the 2019-2020 Handbook. You may also choose to pay your tuition through a secure link on our webpage. The payment link can be found under the ADMISSIONS tab. Payment may also be made by auto-draft. If you did not receive an auto-draft form by email earlier in the summer, please contact the office.





CARPOOL LINE IS A CELL-FREE ZONE AT ALL TIMES. STAY FOCUSED AND KEEP OUR CHILDREN SAFE.



Four cars at a time pull along curb for loading.



Wait at stop sign for next turn in loading zone. Please have your carpool number displayed.



There is no left turn into the parking lot. Follow the route around the police station.



Carpool line is not allowed to occupy the bike lane. Do not block the bike lane on Chapel Hill St. If the parking lot is full, circle around the block.



Parents walking to pickup should line up along the sidewalk with their carpool number in hand.

Use crosswalk at all times. Do not cross between advancing carpool cars.
