Continuing Education for Teachers

DMWS staff stays abreast of best practices in Early Childhood Education by completing training experiences each year. On March 2, our Pre-K and K teachers gained knowledge about incorporating board games into the curriculum. Our 2's and 3's staff learned about science in the outdoor classroom. In addition to the workshops offered on the workday, some of the staff will be completing more virtual training this spring. Topics they will explore include: Environments for Learning: Blocks and Building, Environments for Learning: Art Studio, and Engaging Experiences: Heuristic Play. The staff looks forward to incorporating what they learn into the classroom to enhance the preschool experience for your children.

Stretch Your Child's Thinking

Ever wonder if there are easy ways to help your child develop problem solving skills? Here are some activities to do with your child to help stretch thinking skills.

- Play "What Doesn't Belong"-Look around the room and name any 4 objects (ex. book, shoe, t-shirt, necklace). Have your child decide which one does not belong and why. (ex. the book does not belong since you cannot wear it)
- Play "What Does Belong"- Look around the room and name any 3 objects. Ask your child to think of how they are related and then name a 4th object and explain how it is related.
- Play "Answers and Questions"- You give the answer and ask your child to come up with an associated question. (ex. The answer is a blanket. What is the question?). You can also take turns coming up with as many Questions as you can for a particular answer. (ex. What keeps you warm at night? What do we sit on when we have a picnic?)
- Puppet Problem Solving-Offer a pretend dilemma for puppets and assist your child in acting out the solution. (ex. Oh dear, I have too many books to carry. How can I get them home from the library? Solutions could be: put them in a bag, ask a friend to help carry them)
